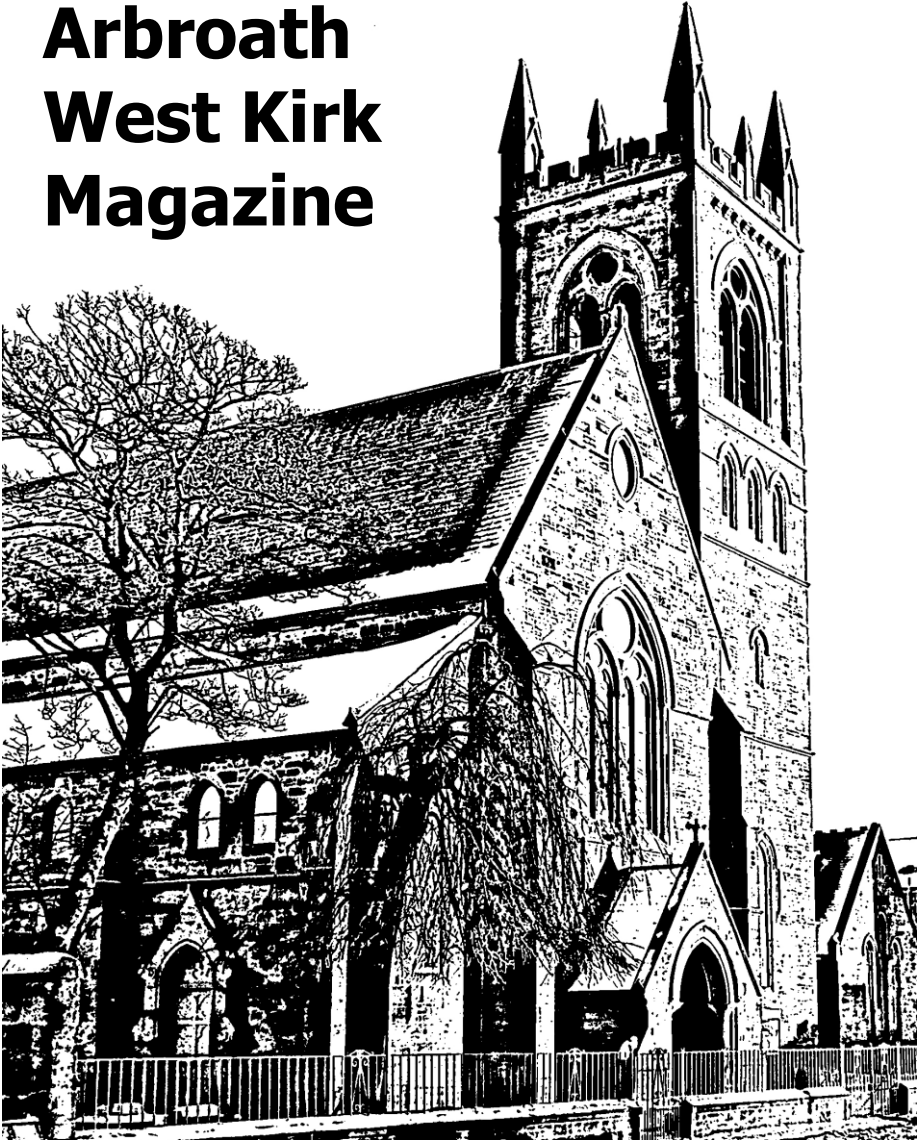

## Chris's Chatter

This month I'm writing to you in the week following the Moderator and his wife's visit to Angus and the West Kirk in order to meet the deadline for the magazine production team and I have to confess I'd never really thought much about what their diary would look like. Last week they were here from Sunday to Sunday with something in the diary everyday in a different part of the region, meeting a wide range of folk of all ages involved in church, community and business life – meeting them with very little background knowledge beforehand, knowing that there would be a certain expectation of their questions and responses. This week he will be in Hungary and the Ukraine returning at the end of the week to moderate the first part of the General Assembly – a completely different group of people with different life experiences but similar levels of expectation.

In our bible study group since Easter, we've been looking at some of the women involved in the New Testament Church and therefore moving from place to place with Paul on his travels – perhaps in some ways the same kind of experience - for each town and community would have its own identity for the visitor to acclimatize to whilst at the same time anticipating a certain response from their guest.

How to maintain one's own identity and integrity in the midst of a whole range of experiences and challenges is part of the conundrum being faced by churches and other organisations across the country as we come out of the last two years and in the case of the church deal with reform that's been overdue but accelerated by recent events whilst at the same time learning from fresh initiatives so that our identity is strengthened.

Hopefully when reading this magazine, you will see that there is a little of both going on over the summer at the West Kirk. Many of the social activities that marked the welcome and fellowship of the church family have been able to return and I'm very grateful to the social core group

for all their hard work. At the same time there are some new things, being tried and tested as a result of the responses to term time activities. For the first time, the West Kirk will be hosting a holiday club – 2 hours each day for a week of crafts, games and bible teaching for primary aged children and in July music lessons for all ages are going to be available. Please pray for the work of the presbytery cluster teams too which will continue over the summer as the new structure is distilled and refined.

Whatever you are doing over the summer season, and this may include the excitement and challenge of a holiday after a long period without one, may the new and/or different experiences provide you with a time of rest and nourishment – a time to recharge the batteries and at the same time to reflect on what is core or central in your life. May the power of the Holy Spirit in this Pentecost season refresh, encourage and inspire you for the journey ahead.

On 15<sup>th</sup> March the members of Angus Presbytery agreed a basis of union to merge the Presbyteries of Angus, Dundee, Dunkeld & Miegle, Perth and Stirling. The same basis of

union has been agreed by all presbyteries and it will now come before the General Assembly. Elaine McLean has agreed to remain in post as Angus Moderator until the new Presbytery, which is going to be called the Presbytery of Perth, begins on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023. What the larger Presbytery will mean for each individual church family remains unclear. It is hoped that we will have more resource to professional expertise and less meeting time, but we wait to see.

Deadlines have now been provided for the presbytery mission planning process that I have outlined in previous editions of the magazine. All

Angus cluster plans must be prepared by the end of June and a conference of all church families is to be held on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> September from 10am-1pm in St Andrew's Church Arbroath. This will be an opportunity to discuss the plan as a whole and approve it before submission to 121 George Street.

As I've said before, 2022 really is a year where significant plans of change will be agreed. Depending on your viewpoint, this can be seen as both an opportunity and a threat. Please continue to pray for those who are involved in the discussions, both ministers and elders, as the proposals have substantial repercussions for both.

### **Update from the Session Clerk**

It is hard to believe that we are halfway through the year already. It's been a busy time here at West Kirk with Church life full on and lovely to see all the activities managing to restart after the restrictions eased and the church building being used by many Church and outside groups. Masks are now no longer required to be worn during worship but we are aware that there will be some of you who prefer to continue to wear one and we ask that everyone continue to be comfortable in their choices and be considerate to those you are sitting beside.

We were delighted to welcome the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and his wife, Lord and Lady Wallace of Tankerness, on the 15<sup>th</sup> May where Lord Wallace took part in our worship and also awarded Long Service Elder Certificates to 13 of our Elders. Coffee after the Service allowed the congregation to meet the Moderator.

### **Long Service Awards**

It was our great pleasure to recognise the service of some of our longest Serving Elders. Covid restrictions over the past 2 years delayed our presentation and it was lovely to be able to mark this occasion with

the Moderator of the General Assembly presenting. The dedication and willingness to serve God and our Church over the years is remarkable and the range of roles undertaken by them all is greatly appreciated by Session and we thank them sincerely. Congratulations to all who received certificates and thank you for all your years of service!

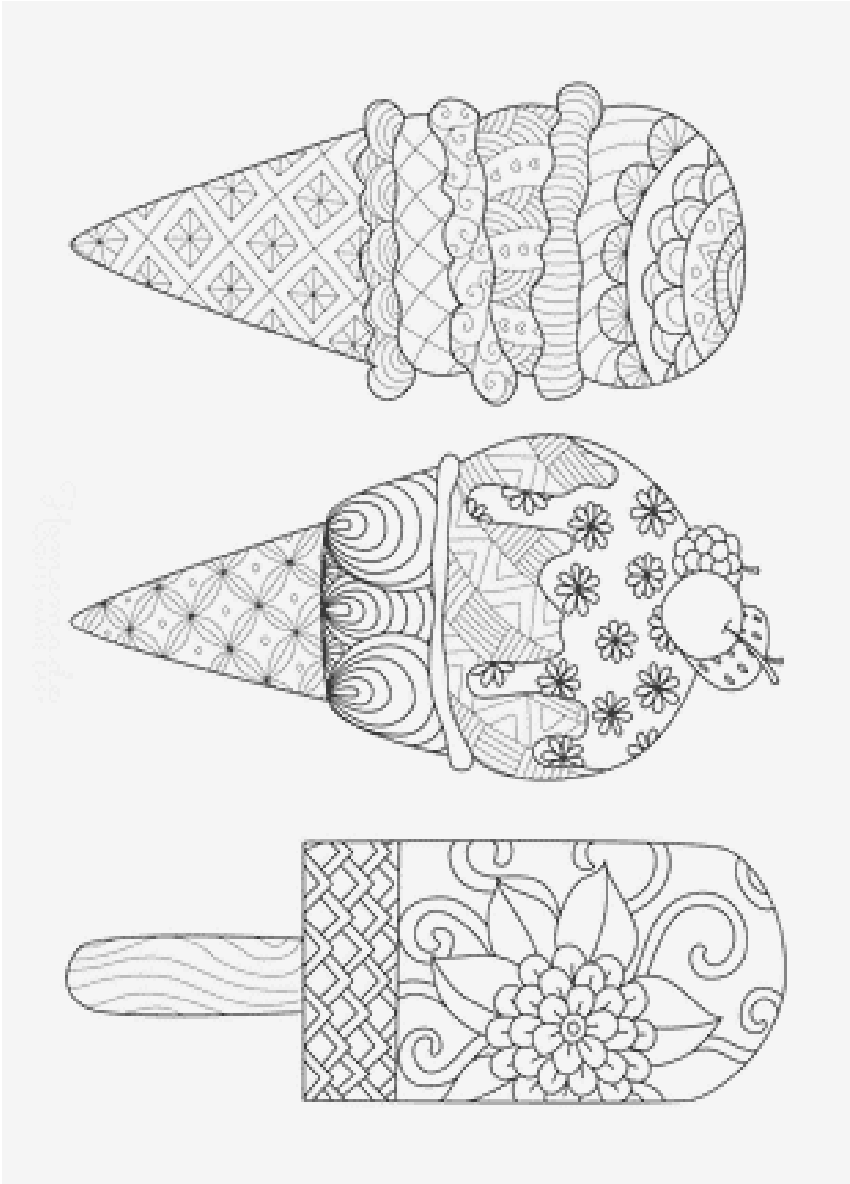

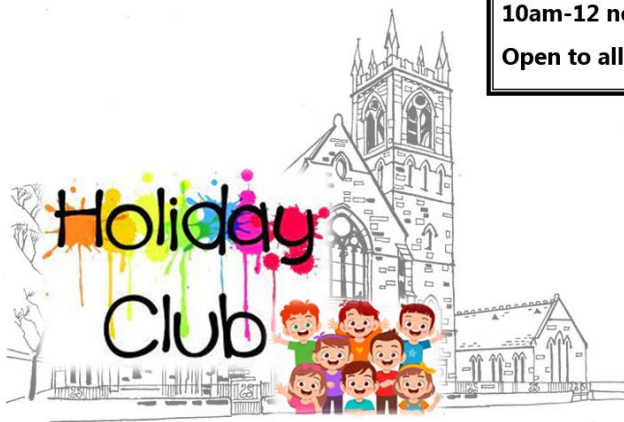
