Advent is a strange time of year – a time of contrasts. On the one hand, we are coming to the end of the Gregorian calendar year with the start of the season of hustle and bustle culminating at Christmas then allowing for a season of reflection on the year that has been whilst on the other, in the church, it's the start of a new



calendar year as we wait and ponder again the unique, mind blowing event of the birth of God's Son on earth.

There seems to be a distinction in our lives between the December deadlines that affect us all – card writing, present purchasing and wrapping, cakes to make and food to order, concerts to attend and participate in, family to visit and invite and the list goes on – no less in the church than in our homes – and the guiet contemplation of the words of the prophets that foretold the birth of a saviour, not in a blaze of trumpets, colour and light but in a dark and dreary cowshed. Remembrance 2023

It has been a busy Remembrance season again this year and not simply the traditional marking of wars past and present.

On Friday 27th October 1953 the Robert Lindsay lifeboat sank just outside Arbroath harbour with all lives but one being lost. It was a very special privilege to be a part of the commemorations with Rev Nick Baker from St John's Methodist Church, to meet descendants of those lost not only from the lifeboat but also the Islandmagee, the boat that was also lost that night and almost certainly fired the flares which initiated the lifeboat launch and to observe most poignantly two lifeboats laying a wreath in rough seas just outside the harbour in memory of those who died. The service in the West Kirk was attended by the current crew, other emergency services and many from the town and beyond.









The week leading up to this year's Remembrance weekend was a busy one for the Guides, Brownies and rainbows of Arbroath and the area. Vicki White and Carla Ingram organised a programme to enable the girls to earn their "Olive" badge, Olive being just one girl representing many guides who were

employed by MI5 in World War 1. The girls looked at what they did and what Remembrance means through relays, secret messages and crafts. These evenings were held in the west Kirk, Friockheim Church and St Andrew's. A HUGE thank you is due to Vicki and Carla for all their work and for the wreaths that we were presented with which we used as part of our Remembrance service on 12th November. Together with assemblies and class visits looking at children who were evacuated and the challenges of peacemaking, our young people have certainly learned how remembrance is relevant to them.

Young people were also in evidence at the War Memorial this year as hundreds came in the sunshine to mark the silence at 2pm and lay wreaths.



Posada – An Advent Experience

As we move towards a union of the churches in and around Arbroath, we're going to adapt a South American tradition which began 400 years ago in countries like Mexico and Guatemala. The idea is that in the season of Advent we reflect on the



journey of Mary and Jospeh and the donkey to Bethlehem and on the number of places that they tried to stay. In South America, the tradition is that over 9 days, each day representing one month of Mary's pregnancy people dress up as the characters and go from house to house looking for a place to stay. They will be rejected at some until a place of hospitality is found.

This tradition has been developed in all sorts of ways the figures moving around the homes of church families, the shops within a community etc. This year Mary, Joseph and the donkey will move around our 9 churches during Advent taken by members of one church family to another. There will be a very short explanation and shared prayer together as we reflect on the birth of our Saviour and the ways in which we all serve him together.

Mary and Joseph 's progress will be advertised in intimations and on social media so please look out for them.

From the Transition Team of Arbroath and District

November 2023

Dear Member,

Towards Arbroath and District Church of Scotland

As you will remember from a previous communication, a congregational vote must be taken to implement the Presbytery Mission Plan to unite the nine churches in this area into one Arbroath and District Church of Scotland. A vote was held earlier this year and two churches voted against the union. Since then:-

- a) Further discussions and question and answer sessions have been offered to all congregations which we hope have clarified some issues.
- b) Several very successful joint services and activities have taken place to increase our understanding of one another and inspire us to see what we can achieve together.
- c) The transition team have spoken to Perth Presbytery with whom final decisions rest.

Sadly, despite our best efforts, the next congregational vote will not include all nine congregations. The congregation of Arbirlot will not be taking part and this is a source of considerable regret and sadness for all involved in this process. From the date of union, they must make a decision to join or to be dissolved, but their former parish areas will still be part of the new union. It is against this background that another vote for the union will be held after worship on **Sunday 3rd December**. Voting is in person only and further details of the basis of Union and Basis of Team Ministry are available at :https://www.arbroathwestkirk.org/about/proposed-union-page/ with paper copies available from all churches from Sunday 19th November.
